ESREA’ s partners: Enhancing links and dialogue between research and practice

ESREA and the **European Association for the Education of Adults (EAEA)** have signed a Memorandum of Understanding for partnership and collaboration. EAEA is a European NGO, based in Brussels, whose purpose is to link and represent European organisations directly involved in adult learning. **with 120** member organisations in 43 countries, it represents more than 60 million learners Europe-wide. EAEA and ESREA share their focus of work in adult education. While ESREA represents research and researchers, EAEA represents providers and practitioners. Both organisations believe that a closer cooperation will benefit both associations and their members, enhance dialogue between research and practice, and enable both organizations to improve their respective work.

Reports on Recent ESREA Network Events

ESREA Network Active Democratic Citizenship and Adult Learning (ADCAL)

Democratic dialogue and debate by the Danube: Network Conference, Belgrade, 26-27 May 2023

The Active Democratic Citizenship and Adult Learning Network held a conference in Belgrade in May of this year. Participants travelled from Finland, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Poland, Serbia, Slovenia Sweden, Italy, Cyprus, and the US and the conference proved both highly stimulating and convivial. As one would expect there were papers and workshops but there were also meetings and discussions with Serbian activists and artists.

The title of the conference was *‘Movements for democracy, critical learning and the limits of what we know’*. A key focus of the conference was on our learning as researchers, adult educators and as a network community. Wrestling with the profoundly serious challenges to democracy and citizenship of our time – to democracy, citizenship, the environment – multiple presentations seemed to be asking or exploring what we might learn from experienced



activists and successful social movements, from failed projects and successful campaigns, from history, policy, and political education programs, and from ordinary citizens pushing back against environmental destruction.

There was genuine curiosity and a sense of exploration as we were invited to consider how we may learn through epiphany, improvisation, and play; or learn collaboratively as communities of inquiry, together with research participants. The presentations and corridor conversations had a deep, reflexive character as we asked ourselves and each other how we may want to engage in research and how we understand the core values and ethics of adult education. Some took the route of theoretical work, clearing some conceptual ground, while others engaged directly with pedagogical questions of how we might want to teach and what could be worth learning.

The conference was marked by a strong sense of care and conviviality – a conscious attempt to create a democratic ethos at the event – and an equally strong sense of urgency about supporting active citizenship and democratic renewal. Reflecting on this conference participants discussed the need to work in a truly interdisciplinary and methodologically innovative way that connects researchers to publics. It is therefore fitting that part of the conference programme involved city walks to better understand grassroots arts and activist initiatives in Belgrade and that throughout the conference there were massive demonstrations in the city directly related to democracy and human flourishing.

The network convenors are currently planning the next network event and ideas for publication.

We also want to mark the fact that Annika Pastuhov and Henrik Nordvall have decided to step down as convenors of our network. We wish to express our deepest gratitude and appreciation for outstanding work. On a happier note, we are excited to welcome Diana Holmqvist as our new co-convenor. Diana has had extensive experience in ESREA and brings this valuable knowledge as well as a fresh perspective to ADCAL.

ESREA Network History of Adult Education and Training in Europe

12th Research Seminar in Strobl, 3-7 July 2023

The twelfth research seminar of the ESREA Network History of Adult Education and Training in Europe was held in Strobl, Austria, from 3rd to 7th July 2023 in The Federal Institute for Adult Education (Bundesinstitut für Erwachsenenbildung, 'bifeb'). Eighteen participants from ten countries (Austria, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Netherlands, Sweden, Turkey and United Kingdom), representing different generations, spent the entire week discussing papers on the topic 'Adult education and learning for social change in the 19th-20th centuries: Ideas, movements, and circulation of knowledge'.

Asking the participants to read the papers prior to the seminar and having sufficient time to discuss each paper in



detail enabled thorough commenting and vivid exchange of ideas as the actual presentations could be kept short. This kind of discussion was intended to assist the authors in preparing a revised paper for inclusion in an edited volume of papers following the seminar, which is now in progress. Accommodation in the residential institute located in beautiful and peaceful surroundings by the lake Wolfgang and close to mountains offered excellent opportunity to intellectual exchange (also during breakfast, lunch and dinner), leisure activities like swimming and

walking in the forest as well as evening gatherings at the institute's bar. We are grateful to our Austrian colleagues and the personnel of bifeb for their contribution in organizing the seminar and the Austrian Ministry of Education, Science and Research for its support which made this meeting possible.
